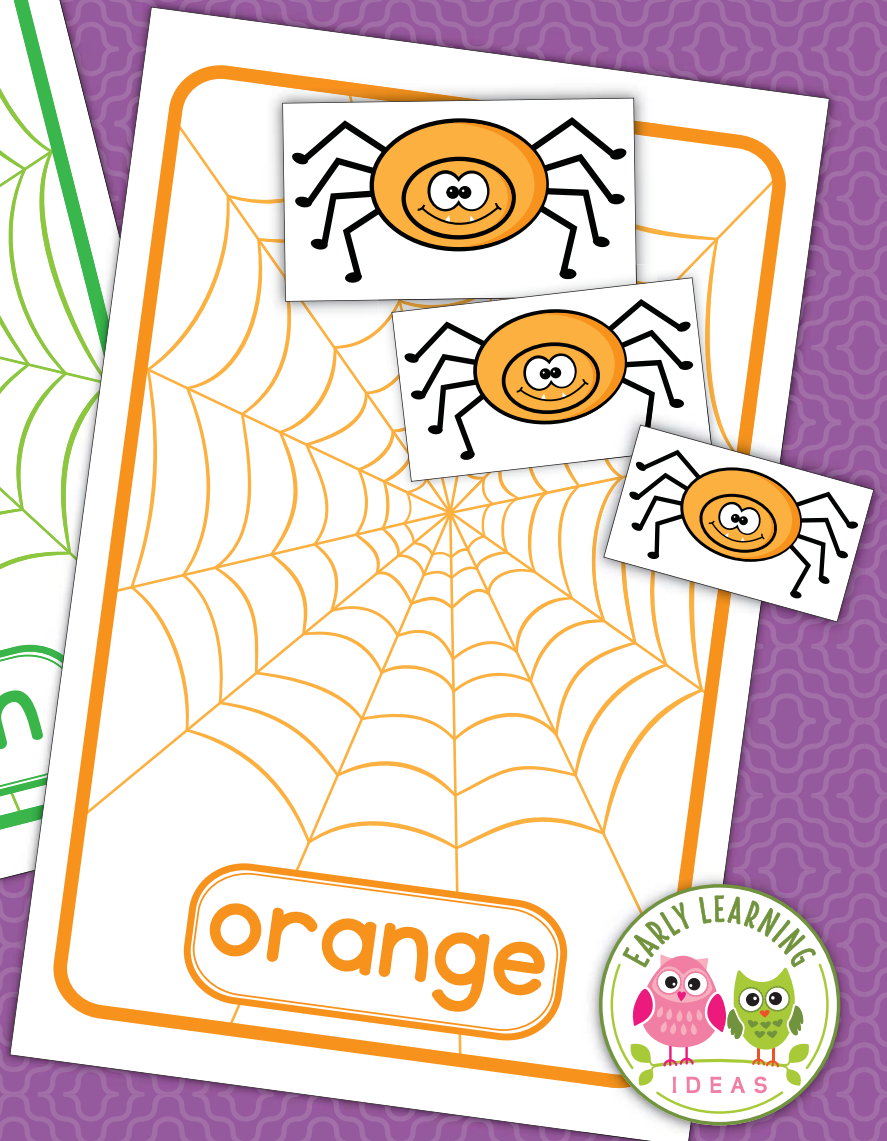
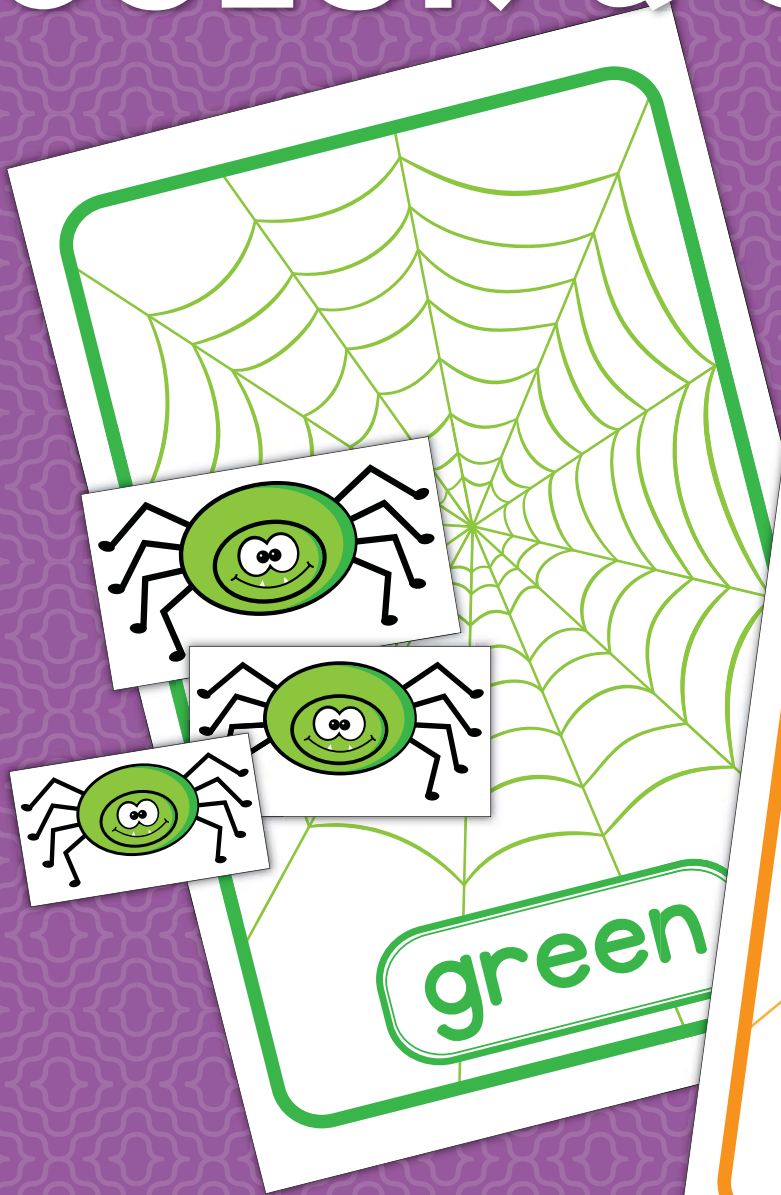


SPIDER

COLOR & SIZE SORT



SPIDER COLOR & SIZE SORT



This Set includes 10 different colors of spiders in 3 different sizes, 10 colored webs, and 3 size webs. Younger children may be overwhelmed when trying to do the following activities with too many color choices. Use the appropriate quantity of spiders and webs for your students.

Print the spider webs and an appropriate number of spiders for your activities. Cut out on the dotted lines and laminate for durability.

Ideas for Play:

Matching Sets: Place several color webs and 1 spider for each web on a table. Ask children match the spiders with a web.

Sort By Color: Place webs and an assortment of spiders and color webs face up on a table. Ask the children to place the spiders on the corresponding colored web.

Object Counting - 1 to 1 Correspondence: Provide an assortment of spiders on a web or ask children to place the spiders on a web. Ask children to count the spiders as they take them off the web and place them in a line on the table.

Comparing Sets: Place an assortment of spiders and matching color webs on a table, being sure that there are different quantities of spiders in each color. Ask the children to place the spiders on the corresponding colored webs. Ask children to determine which web has the most spiders and which has the least spiders on them.

Object Counting/Cardinality: Ask children to place a number of spiders on each web. For example: ask them to place 5 spiders on each web.

Sort by Size: Place an assortment of spiders and sized webs on a table. Ask children to place all of the small spiders on the small web, all of the medium spiders on the medium web, and all of the large spiders on the large web.

Seriation: Place an assortment of spiders on the table. Ask the children to sort the spiders by color and line each color set in a line from smallest to largest.

Fill the Web Game: Give each child a color web. Use 5 spiders for each color of web. Shuffle the spiders, turn them face down, and spread them in the center of the table. Have the children take turns picking spiders, naming the color of the spider, and putting them in the appropriate colored web. The first child with 5 spiders in his or her web wins.

Patterns: Provide an assortment of 2-4 colors of spiders. Ask the children to create patterns with the spiders.

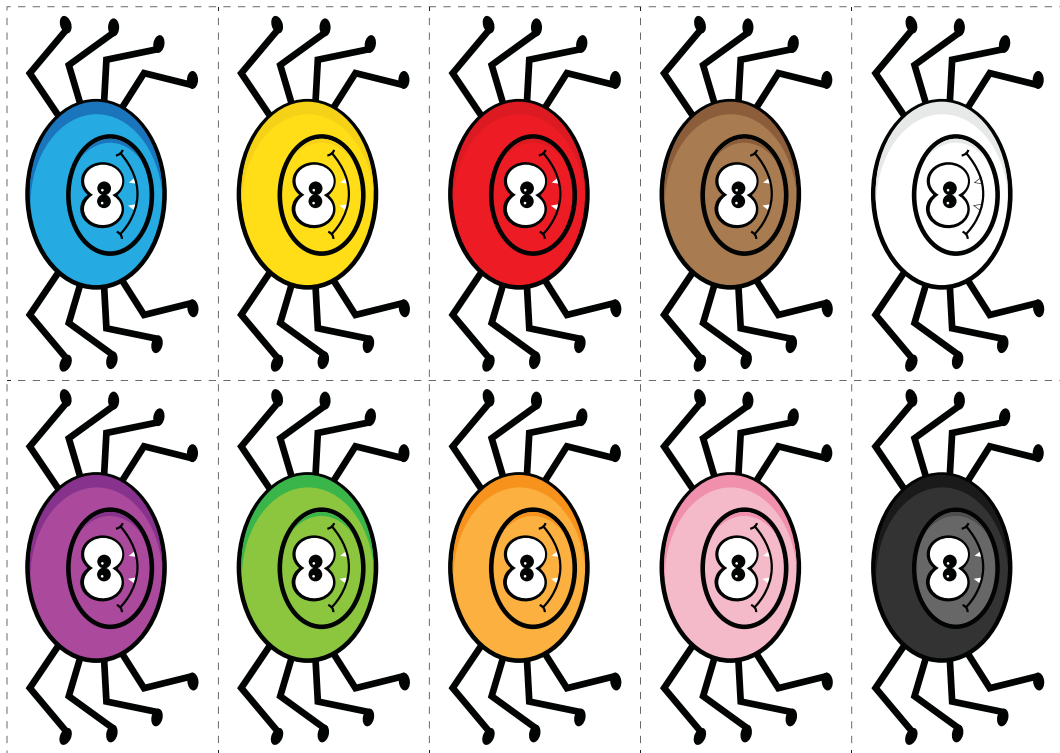
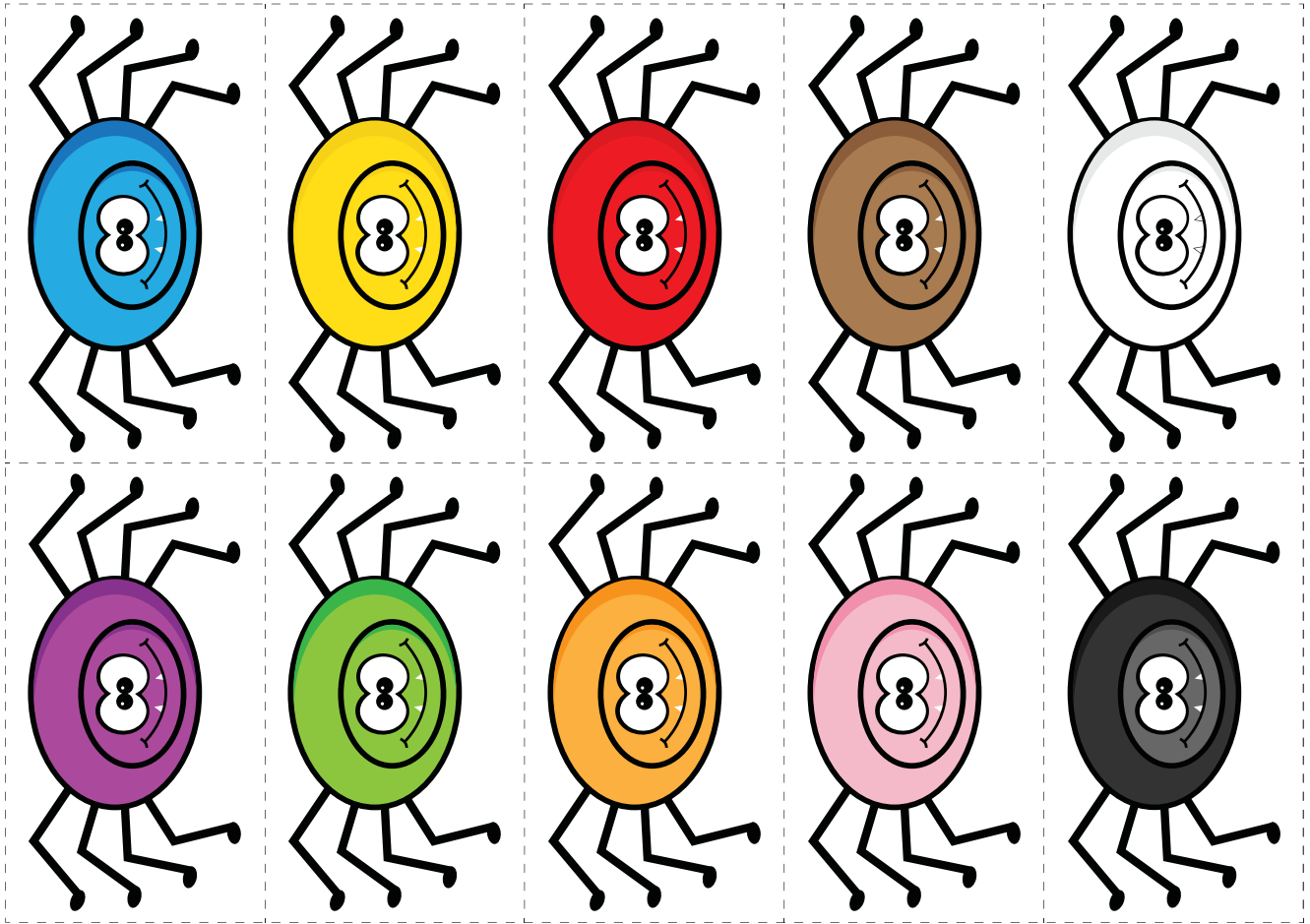
Magnet Board: Attach magnets to the back of each spider and use the set on cookie sheets or magnetic boards.

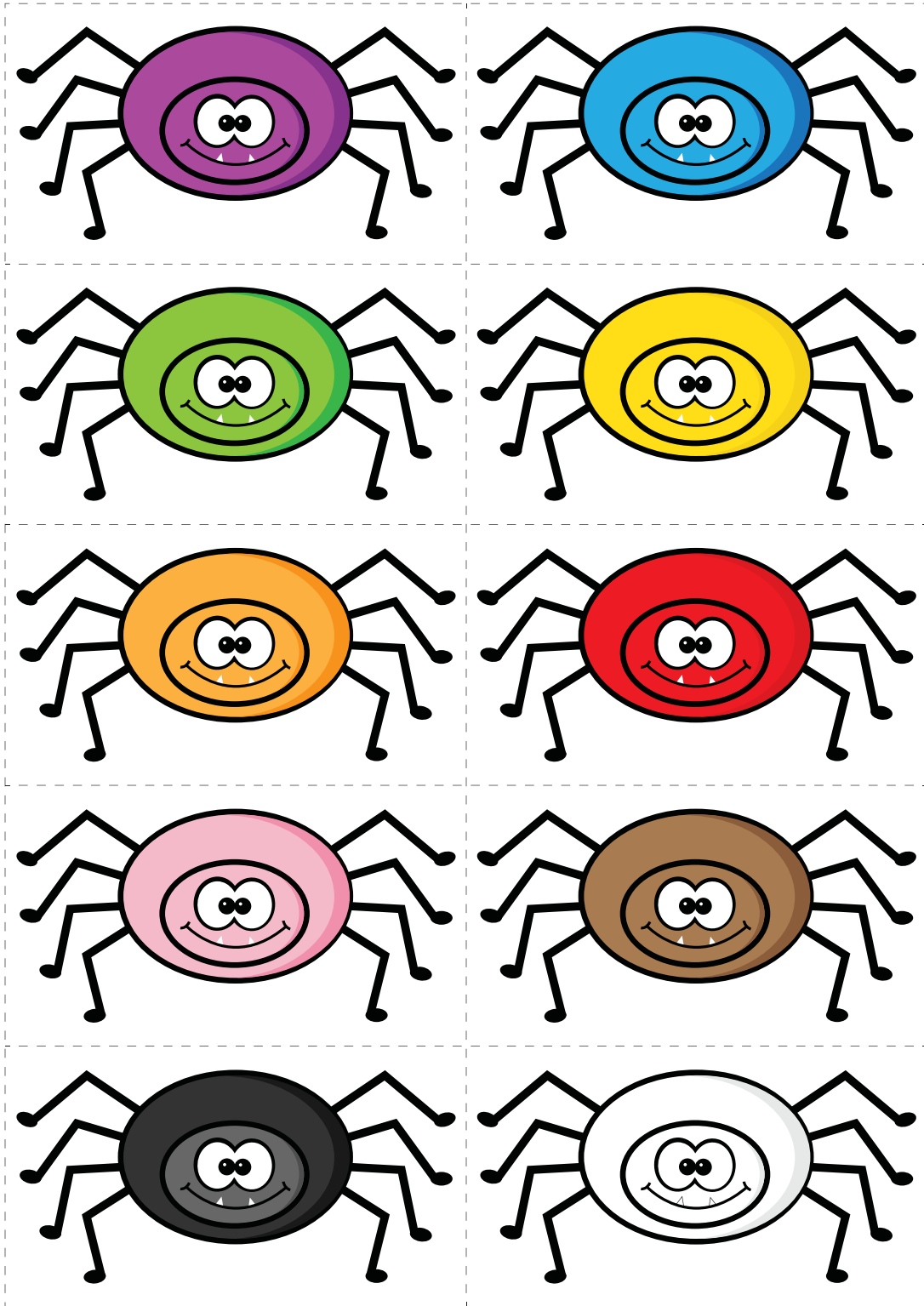
Busy Book: Attach self-adhesive velcro to the back of each spider and to several spots on each of the colored webs so that children can attach spiders to the webs. Bind the nests together and use as a lap book or busy book.

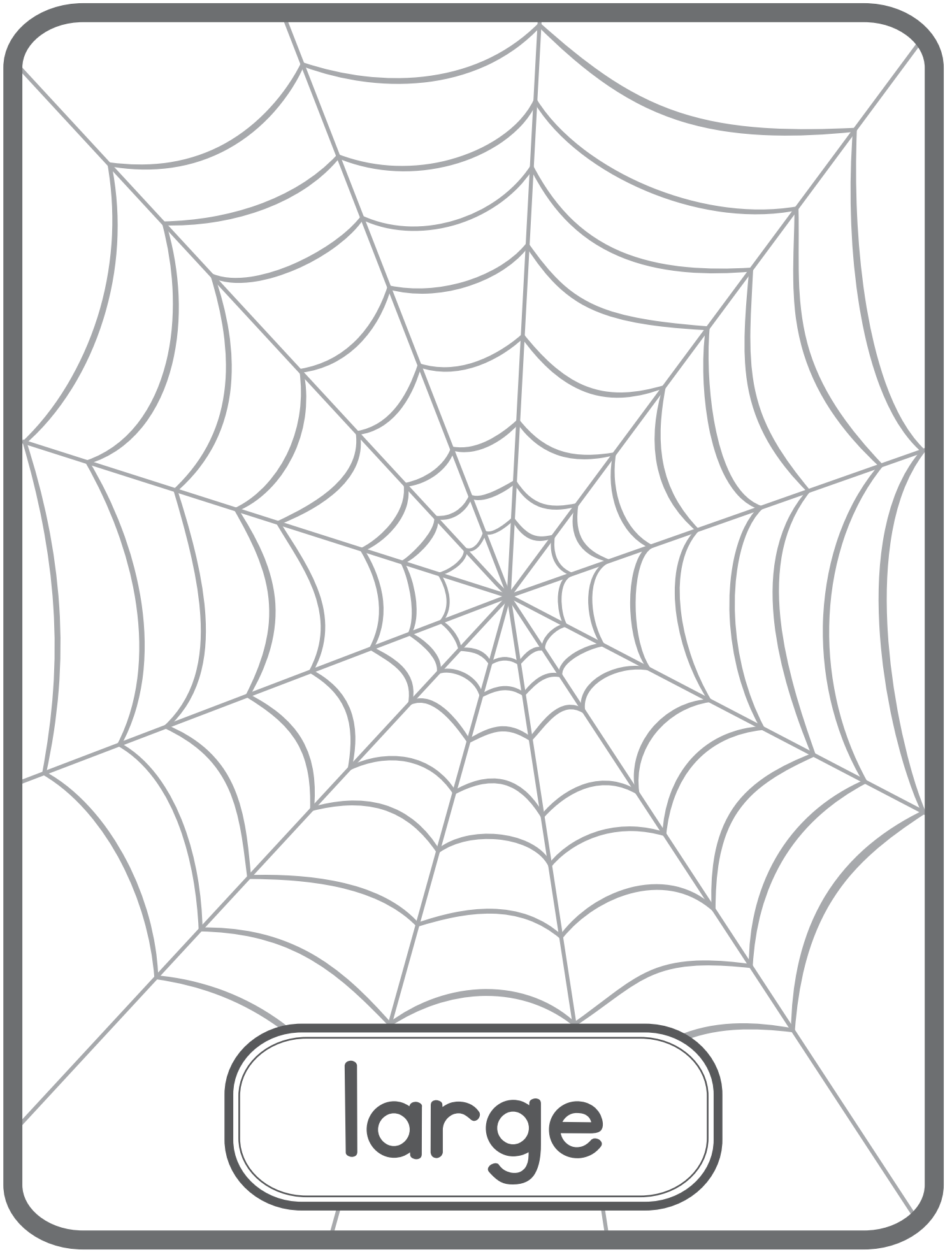
